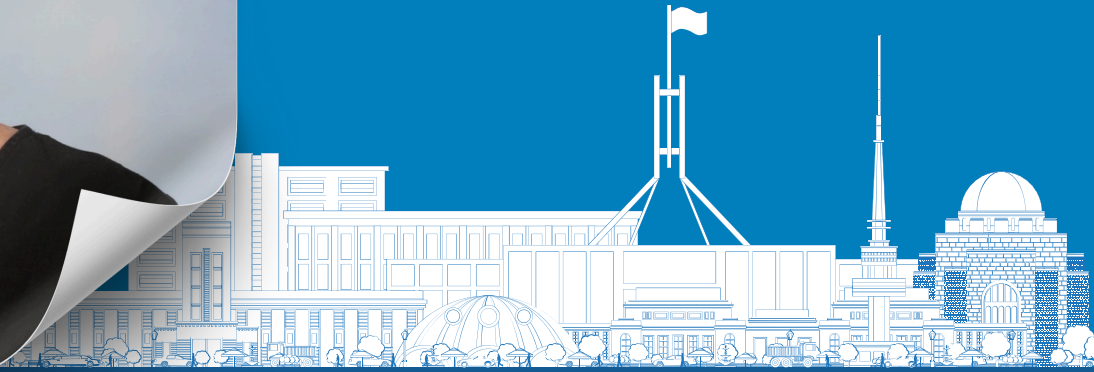




Building tomorrow's minds :
